



About the program

The County of Los Angeles guides youth on their way to become self-sufficient and productive adults in their communities. The program achieves its goals by placing youth in permanent employment, helping them receive a high-school diploma or equivalent and transitioning them into higher education.

Program eligibility

Based on the WIA (Workforce Investment Act of 1998) guidelines, youth must:

- ☼ Be between the ages of 17 to 24;
- ☼ A resident of the Glendale, Burbank and Verdugo areas
- ☼ Be in the low-income bracket;
- ☼ Have barriers to employment (i.e., basic skills in either English or Math below 8.9 level, parenting youth, ex-offender, homeless, etc.);
- ☼ Be a legal resident of the U.S.
- ☼ Males 18 and over must be registered with Selective Service.
